



THE GREAT THANKSGIVING | EUCHARISTIC PRAYER FOR CREATION SEASON

Celebrant The Lord is here.

People God's Spirit is with us.

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People We lift them to the Lord.

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD


The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.
